In 2016, Ms. Alliot became managing director of the Cité internationale des arts, one of the world's largest research and creative residency centers, simultaneously hosting 325 artists.

Since 2017, the Cité has been rethinking its hospitality mission, opening up to non- or under-represented scenes while developing special programs for artists in exile. The Cité promotes artists through a dense program focusing on solidarity and inclusion. Ms. Alliot sits on many award juries.

Since the festival's creation, a resident artist has been invited to present his or her vision of Corbeil-Essonnes.

The work is exhibited at a solo show during the next year's festival. All L'Œil Urbain exhibitions are free.

That concept has led them to prefer thinking about projects individually, instead of as part of a collection, and to work with different graphic artists. They have published young photographers like Salvi Danés, Israel Ariño, Eduardo Nave and Juanan Requena as well as more established names such as José Manual Navia and Cristóbal Hara.

Svetlana Bachevanova is the executive director of the FotoEvidence Association in France and a co-founder of the acclaimed publishing house FotoEvidence Press (New York 2010). The books she and her team publish expose injustice, create enduring evidence of violations of human rights and inspire social change. Svetlana has worked with some of the most skilled and dedicated documentary photographers to publish their work, human stories recounting indisputable evidence of social injustice. In addition to managing the publication of books, the FotoEvidence exhibits she curated have been mounted around the world to promote change. Svetlana conceived the FotoEvidence Book Award and the W Award for women to support the work of photographers dedicated to the pursuit of human rights, publishing work that is unlikely to find commercial publication.

Under her management FotoEvidence has occupied a unique space in the world of photojournalism as both a publishing house and activist organization. Svetlana's life as a photojournalist and human rights activist started underground at the first anticommunist newspaper in Bulgaria (1988). Today she is leading an organization that supports photojournalists like her and her former colleagues, who bring light to dark places and move people to action.

Has published four photobooks, the recent one - 'The Scene' - being about alternative youth subculture in Latvia.

In this context, they co-authored two books, Le pouvoir de l'intime dans la photographie documentaire (2020, Arnaud Bizalion éditeur) and Insurrection créatrice et photographie documentaire (2020, Arnaud Bizalion éditeur).

He has supported the artistic direction of Photosa, the photographic biennale of Burkina Faso in Ouagadougou, since 2022, and written contributions for the Arles Arts & Culture Louis Vuitton City Guide since 2021, the same year he co-founded La Kabine, a space of artists' workshops, residences and an educational program in Arles. Recent exhibitions he has curated include Les communs, 2023, Centre photographique Marseille x Beaux-Arts de Marseille; Ascendance, 2022, Fondation MRO, Arles; L'enfant sauvage et le douanier globetrotteur, 2022, Musée départemental des Hautes-Alpes, Gap; Dress Code, 2022, Rencontres d'Arles, Fondation MRO, Arles, mobility in Berlin and Cadaquès; You Could Even Die For Not Being A Real Couple, 2022, Photolux Festival, Lucca, Italy; Echos Système, 2021, Fondation MRO, Rencontres d'Arles; Modernité des Passions, 2019, Rencontres d'Arles, ENSP x agnès b.

Arnaud Bizalion was born and raised in Arles, the city of photography with an outstanding ancient heritage. As a child, he took drawing lessons with the Hungarian artist Sandor before participating in workshops in Arles and Avignon, where he attended university.

In parallel, he was interested in every form of artistic expression, including photography. In 1978, he was admitted to the E_cole Nationale Supérieure des Beaux-Arts d'Aix-en- Provence. In 1980, he continued in an MFA program in photography at Beaux-Arts de Marseille-Luminy, where Bernard Perrine was his teacher.

In 1983, Mr. Bizalion co-founded the company Images En Manœuvres, which he co-directed until 2013, when he created the Arnaud Bizalion Éditeur publishing company, which publishes about 10 photography and art books a year. To date, 120 titles have been published. They are disseminated by CEDIF and distributed by Pollen.

In 2014, ParisBerlin→fotogroup founded the Monat der Fotografie-OFF festival in Berlin and the FOTOHAUS exhibition, which since 2022 has taken place every year in three cities: Bordeaux, Arles and Berlin.

Françoise Bornstein earned a double master's in law and art history before turning to photography. In the mid-1980s, she started working for a photographers' agent specializing in fashion and spent several years in charge of visuals for the fashion desk at Marie Claire magazine. In 1993, she opened her own agency of photographers and illustrators before working in advertising as an art buyer. Ten years later, she created the Sit Down agency and broadened her activities to include artistic direction, exhibition curating and publishing and disseminating works by artists working in the areas of photography, fashion and design. In 2005, she opened the Sit Down gallery, which hosts multidisciplinary exhibitions, next to the Picasso Museum in Paris. Since 2013, the gallery has focused on contemporary photography. It promotes young emerging photographers (Aurore Bagarry, Sandra Mehl, Florian Ruiz, etc.) as well as internationally recognized ones such as Tom Wood, Yan Morvan, Robert McCabe and Sacha.

In 2017, she opened a new pop-up space, La Chambre de la Collectionneuse, which hosts quarterly discussions with the gallery's photographers or guest artists. Sit Down also participates in international fairs such as Photo Basel in Switzerland, Paris Photo in Paris and the Photography Show presented by Aipad in New York.

Marie Magnier and Charlotte Boudon are art directors of the Filles du calvaire gallery, considered one of France's best photography galleries. It is particularly recognized for its programming and policy in favor of contemporary photography.

The gallery actively supports the work of about 20 artists, half of them photographers, and produces over 30 outside exhibitions a year. It also contributes to the publication of many books.

The selection is open to emerging artists, whom the gallery often discovers, and to artists in mid-career. Filles du calvaire collaborates with many institutions in France and abroad. Ms. Boudon and Ms. Magnier are often invited to participate in award juries and photography portfolio reviews.

The Annie Gabrielli gallery was created in October 2011. In late 2020, it became a mobile gallery that travels to places depending on the projects and artists. Based in Montpellier, it focuses on contemporary photography and multidisciplinary experiments (video, drawings, installations). It represents, promotes and supports emerging and established artists, each of whom uses his or her own language to express a reflection on our humanity.

The gallery does not exhibit nudes, conventional travel photographs or illustrative pictures (nature, architecture, etc.). Participations: 2012 to 2016, 2019: Boutographies (Rencontres Photographiques de Montpellier): exhibitions, Between 2012 and 2019, the gallery takes part of Les Boutographies (Rencontres Photographiques de Montpellier): with exhibitions and portfolios reviews.

In 2013, she is part of the Boutographies jury and has an exhibition called Chorus, for "Off" Arles. Between 2013 and 2019, she is a reviewer for the Photo Folio Review in Arles.

The gallery is cofounder of the event Open spaces in 2015, an art contemporary circuit in Montpellier with a multidisciplinary program. Multiple times, the gallery works (2015, 2016, 2017) with Fotofever (contemporary photography) at Le Caroussel du Louvre à Paris, as well as with La Fondation Manuel Rivera-Ortiz in Arles in 2017 and Lille Artup! In 2019 for a focus on photography. In 2018 she was a part of YIA Artfair (contemporary art) at the Carreau du Temple in Paris and of Lille Artup! In 2020. In 2021, she joins Solid'art and the Secours Populaire in Montpellier.

During 2013-2018 he worked as artistic director of the Triennial of Photography in Hamburg (Germany) and since 2018 as curator and collaborator of the Ci.CLO Porto Biennale (Portugal). Krzysztof works internationally as a guest curator and visiting lecturer in numerous organisations, museums, schools, and festivals in Europe.
